A Message From the President: By Jeffery Flaws

Beginning in November the Village will be constructing the next phase of the sanitary sewer project serving businesses along Highway 18, the two schools and the Lincolnshire residential development. This phase, located adjacent to the Kwik Trip at 18 and 83, will entail the construction of the lift station that will send effluent to the city of Waukesha for treatment. The final phase will involve the collector pipers and force main, with completion by the end of 2015.

Construction on the Highway 83 project will continue this year as long as weather permits, with the installation of a temporary roundabout at Highways 18 & 83 allowing construction of a permanent one to proceed inside it. Please keep safety in mind as you navigate the construction zone and the temporary roundabout this fall and winter.

As always, we will continue to use this newsletter, the Village's website, the coverage of Village activities as reported in the *Kettle Moraine Index*, and the postings of our various agendas to keep you informed as 2014 ends and 2015 progresses. However, building, remodeling, alterations or additions thereto, roofing, heating, air-conditioning, plumbing, electrical work, swimming pools, installation of wood burning heating systems, fences, decks, sheds, outbuildings, etc., will require a permit. Burning Ordinance


Burning of garbage and trash prohibited. No person shall burn garbage, paper, putrid materials, buildings or other structures, lumber, construction materials, or materials from razed buildings. The burning of dry brush, dry leaves, dry limbs, dry plant clippings, dry branches and dry logs is allowed subject to various regulations as listed in the Village's current burning ordinance. Burning days are as follows:

November 15 – March 15: Every day, 8 a.m. to sunset.

March 16 – November 14: Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, 8 a.m. to sunset.

Burning on any commercial, business or other property within the Village, except for residential, is hereby prohibited.

Streetlights Burned Out?

The Village of Wales pays a monthly fee to WE Energies to provide electricity and perform maintenance on our Village streetlights. If you notice a light out you can either contact WE Energies directly by calling 1-800-242-9137 or online at www.weenergies.com/night_aura. Please have the location of the pole and the pole number, which can be found on a metal tag on the pole. You may also contact the Village Hall at 262-968-3968 and we can forward the information to them.

Single Sort Recycling, Coming to a Village near you soon

Changes are coming for residents of Wales, as we participate in the Waukesha County recycling program. In 2015 the County recycling program will convert from the current *dual stream* recycling to *single sort* recycling, which only requires residents to separate recyclables from trash and accepts all plastics (#1-7) along with paper, cardboard, aluminum, glass, tin and cartons.

These recycling program changes will include the delivery of new recycling and trash containers and different collection schedules; recyclables will be collected every two weeks and trash/garbage every week. More materials will be recycled and diverted from landfills, decreasing disposal costs and increasing the convenience of mixing all recyclables in one container. Shred Event

Snowplowing Season is Just Around the Corner

Reminder: Village Ordinances prohibit snow from private properties being plowed across or onto Village right-of-way. If you do either you may be issued a citation and/or assessed cleanup costs.

Markers

If you wish to install snowplow markers on your property please adhere to the following guidelines: the markers must be flexible and/or breakaway (usually plastic or fiberglass). They should be set 10 to 20 feet apart. Metal stakes are NOT allowed. The Village is not responsible for any damage to private markers placed in the Village right-of-way.

Mailboxes

The Village is not responsible for mailboxes that are damaged by snow load or ones that were already loose and knocked over by snow load. Check your mailbox and repair any loose, damaged or inadequately anchored ones. If the snowplow contractor hits your mailbox, please report it promptly to the Village Hall so that we can look into the damage.

Miscellaneous Items

The Village is not responsible for and will not replace underground sprinkler heads, lamp posts or other obstacles located in the Village's right-of-way if damaged during normal plowing operations.
